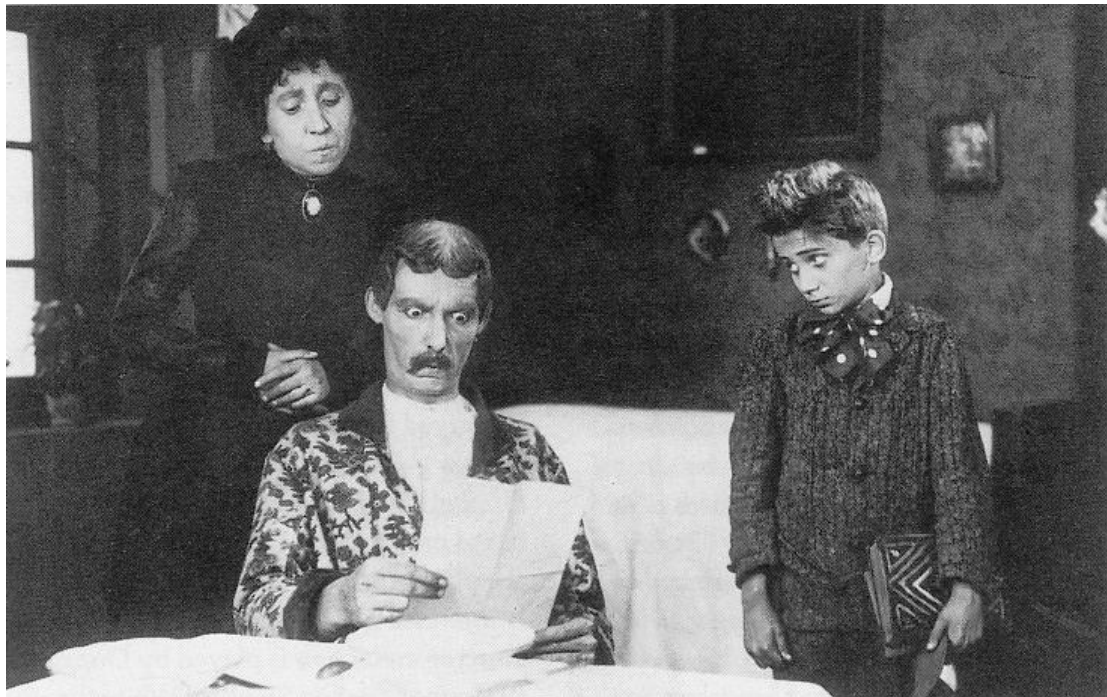

The Moving Picture Boy entry:

“Adolf Karel, son of stage director Richard Branald, was the first notable boy actor of the Czech screen, with a face that could be droll or sensitive. After devoting his young adult days largely to the theatre, plus a spell as a railway employee, Karel Branald - by now less keen on the name Adolf - emerged as one of Czechoslovakia’s leading postwar novelists. Two of his first successes concerned railway workers’ resistance to the Nazis. His first film scenario was a version of his book “*Dedecek Automobil*”.”
