The Moving Picture Boy entry:

"Handsome Thomas B. Carnahan acted as a child for Biograph, Vitagraph, Kinemacolor, Metro, Pathé, Fox and Thanhouser, to name but a few. From 1911 he was a celebrated figure, in a small way, on the New York stage, then undergoing a vogue for "Children's Theater" - children playing adult roles. He played Dick Deadeye in an all-kid production of "HMS Pinafore", but later specialised in "old man" roles.

In 1914, however, he played Cedric Fauntleroy in Toronto. An uncritical critic called him "a master mimic, a remarkable beauty, a child marvel".

On film, "Junior" Carnahan had the lead in Kinemacolor's **"JACK AND THE BEANSTALK"**, and in **"CHRIS AND THE WONDERFUL LAMP"** acted opposite himself in double image. Twenty years later, as plain Thomas Carnahan, he was still acting on stage, a serious, good-looking leading man."
