The Moving Picture Boy entry:

"It was said that William Kimberley (as he was billed in early years) had made over 600 appearances on the Broadway stage, as actor, dancer and singer, before he was twelve. Since he was also a healthy-looking curly

blond, with a determined bull-froggish look that recalled the pre-war German Wolfgang Kieling, it's not clear why his only lead was as the hero of a gloriously silly boy-and-dog adventure called "**SHEP COMES HOME**".

In this he evades consignment to an orphanage, and while on the run with Shep contrives to outwit and capture a brace of bank robbers. It's an epic – directed by the reliable Ford Beebe – that richly deserves revival on TV.

Billy Kimbley doesn't seem to have made any film appearances after 1951.”
